

HOMEWORK POLICY

VISION

At Rosary School we work in partnership to educate young people to take their place effectively in the Church and the world.

RATIONALE

At Rosary School we believe that homework should reinforce the learning in the classroom. It is a continuation of the classroom and is intended to enrich student learning.

We acknowledge that families have multi-faceted lifestyles and need to achieve a balance between work and play. The setting of homework needs to consider the differing learning styles of each student, differing family circumstances and a families after school commitments.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Homework is a partnership between school and home; teacher, parent/caregiver and child each having responsibilities.

The parent/caregiver's role is to:

- Provide an environment where the child might comfortably work
- Encourage and give help where appropriate
- Communicate with the teacher if any issues arise

The child's role is to:

- Accept responsibility for completing the homework
- Seek help from the teacher and family if necessary

The teacher's role is to:

- Provide relevant and meaningful homework activities
- Ensure children know what is expected
- Follow up as appropriate

GUIDELINES

As a guide the following times are suggested:

Reception	10 minutes	Years 3-4	20 - 30 minutes
Years 1-2	10 - 20 minutes	Years 5-6	30 - 40 minutes

Homework will normally not be set on weekends.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Keep to the time stated even if work is incomplete
- Non-classroom teachers need to consult with classroom teachers before setting after school activities to ensure children are not in overload
- Use a timer
