2025 THEME BASED ON OUR DOMINICAN PILLAR OF PRAYER

I am truly blessed to be the new APRIM at Rosary School Catholic community. From the very first day as a new staff member, I received such a warm welcome. I feel that I've been here for a while now because I've been made to feel that I truly belong. Thank you to everyone in this special place! My thoughts are also with the children and their families, especially our Reception children, as they begin their new school-life with a sense of apprehension and excitement, grounded by a sense of hope.

My initial responsibility in this new role was to improvise and create the theme presentation for 2025, focusing on one of the school's

Pillars that enhances the Dominican charism. This was a great task to begin my time at Rosary because it helped me to reflect on this school community's core values, residing in the Dominican tradition. However, this charism goes even deeper than that! These Dominican ideals which emerge through its historical heritage, is at the heart of all that we do in this place. The four Pillars: Prayer, Ministry, Study, and Community tailor our Catholic vision and connect us to the relevance of the Gospel message in this school context. "Religious Life of Rosary School"







Drop off /pick up facility

This is a reminder about the use of our drop off/pick-up facility at the eastern end of the school site, providing an additional option for dropping off and collecting your children (please note, this is NOT for foot traffic).

The facility works best for everyone if cars are stopped for the shortest possible time. This ensures a continual flow of traffic, and the wait time and queues are as short as they can be. Please note, this means that if you are waiting for your child longer than 2 minutes at pick-up, you will be asked by staff to leave the zone and re-enter the school.

The facility is one-way, with a left turn in from Gladstone Road and a left-turn out to Staples Court (no right turn from Gladstone Road).



In the morning, the gates open at 8.20am until 8:45am. In the afternoon, the gates open at approximately 3pm and close at 3:20pm.

Please time your arrival in the afternoon after the gates are open. If you arrive at the school while the gates are closed, or the queue is full, **do not queue on Gladstone Road**. This creates congestion on the road and is contrary to the Australian Road Rules. You will need to drive away and park for a short time until the gates are open. Please drive safely and be respectful of other drivers and students at all times.

Other options

Remember you can also drop your children off or pick them using the on-street parking around the school, or by cycling or walking to the school.


If you are walking to the school from Prospect Road along Staples Court, please use the footpath on the southern (Jubilee Centre) side of the school. The new drop-off/pick-up driveway will be busy with cars leaving the school, so walking on the other side of the road will be a safer route.

OSHC parking

If you are dropping off or collecting your children from OSHC, please do not park on Staples Court. The City of Prospect is reviewing the parking restrictions on this road, as these spaces are difficult to access due to the narrow width of the road.

To drop off in the morning for OSHC, you are able to park on Gladstone Road (front of school) and walk through the school to Staples Court.

To pick up **after school,** you will be able to use the staff car park on Burrage Place between the hours of 3:30pm and 6pm. At these times, there should be spaces available which are not being used by
