Congratulations to the following students who have been elected as SRC representatives for semester 1 2022.

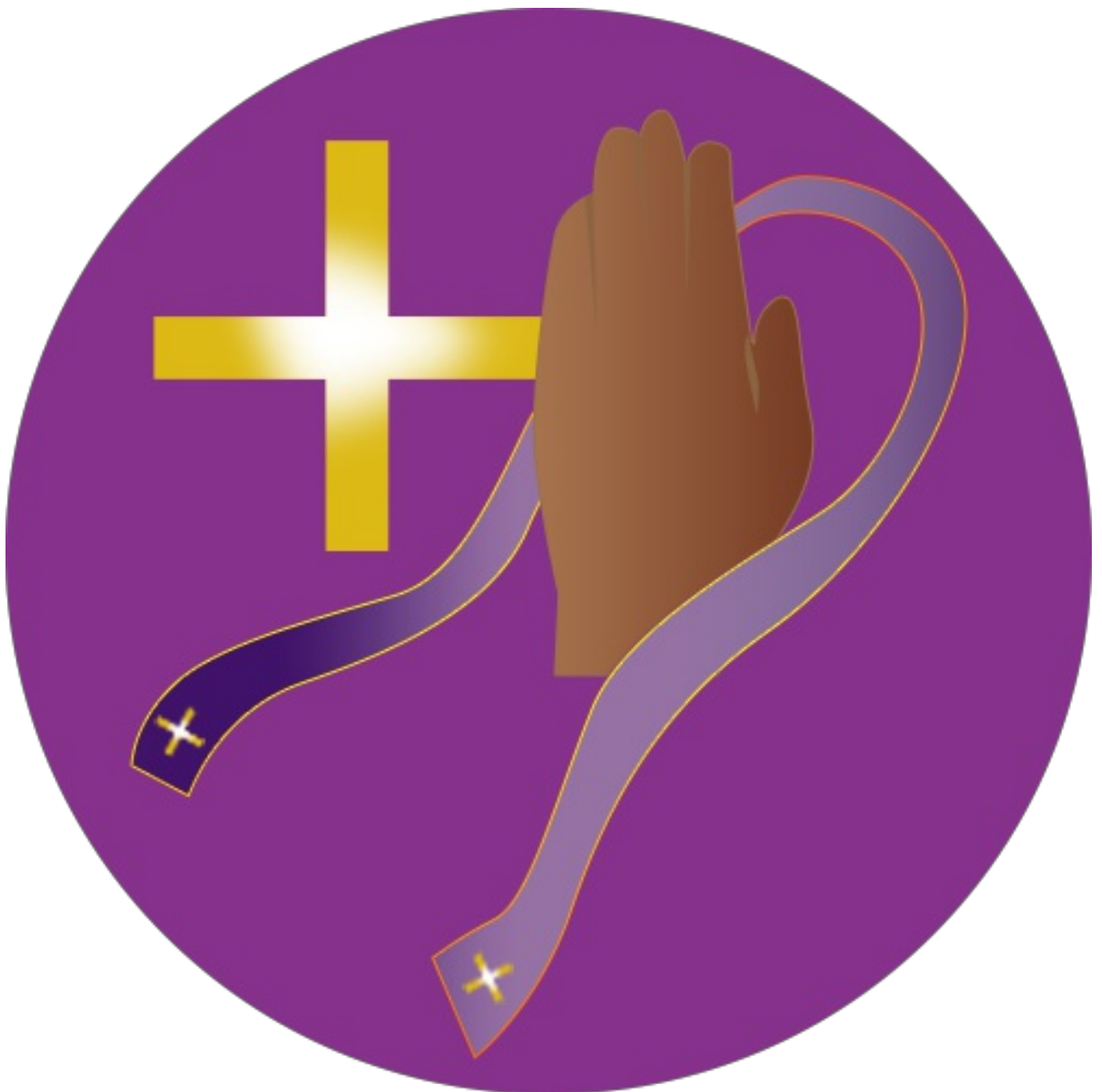

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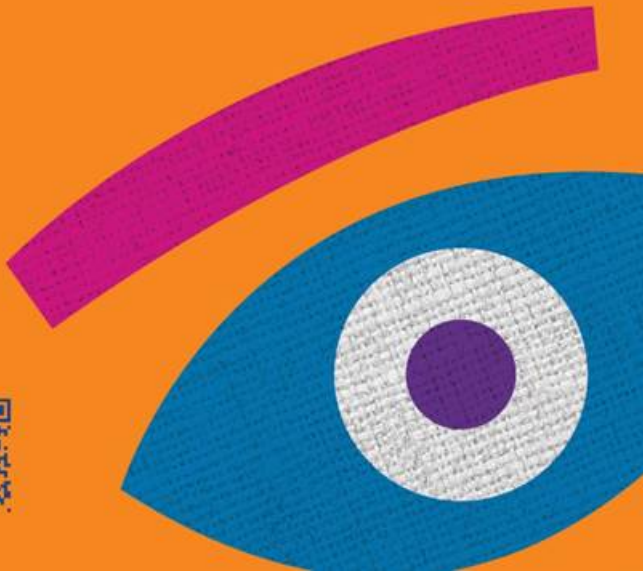

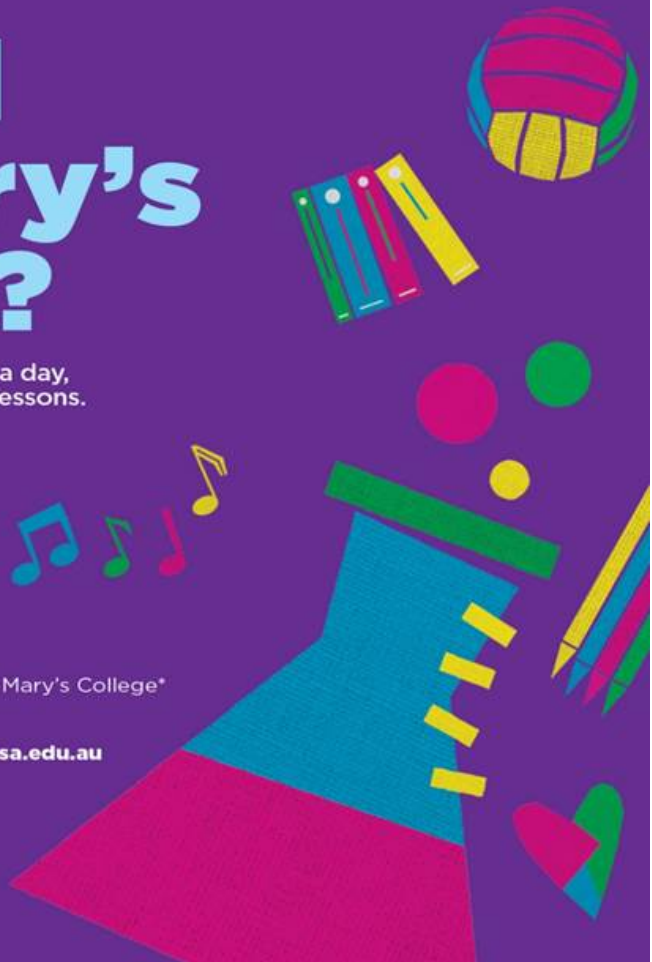
