Dear Rosary School Community

It has been an exciting week moving into our new building. Whilst we are still waiting on the arrival of some furniture, the value added by new teaching, learning and breakout spaces is already being appreciated by the children and the teachers.

Next Thursday we will open the building between 8.00am and 8.30am and from 3.00pm to 3.30pm for any families that would like to walk through the new learning spaces.

As we enter into these cold winter months, I remind families to keep children home when they are sick.

At school we continue to teach children good hygiene and other healthy habits. We remind children to:

1. Stay home when you are sick
2. Cover your mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing
3. Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth
4. Practising hand hygiene

Teachers keep their teaching and learning spaces clean, regularly wiping down surfaces to prevent the spread of germs. We really appreciate your co-operation in reducing the spread of diseases.

Tomorrow is a pupil free day and the teaching staff will engage in some wellbeing professional learning – “Circle Time”. Circle time supports the development of respectful social interactions among children and it helps children develop positive relationships.

The Resilience Project


On Monday May 20 we had a Parent Information Session on the Resilience Project.

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LONG ROAD BACK TO SCHOOL

The Bakhtari family made headlines around the world in 2004 when they were deported in the middle of the night by Australian immigration officials after fleeing Afghanistan four years earlier. Two decades later, one of the Bakhtari children, Nagina Zahra, is back living in Adelaide and recently began teaching at the school she attended while the family was under the care of Contacare Catholic Family Services. In an exclusive interview with KATIE SPAIN, Nagina recalls those traumatic times and her journey back to St Aloysius College where she is now helping students like Zahal (pictured with Nagina) settle into their new home.
